What is the “Study of the U.S. Institutes?” – SUSI

- It is a fully-funded five-week leadership training program in the United States for undergraduate students.
- Participants develop leadership and collective problem-solving skills, exploring U.S. history and culture to expand their leadership skills and knowledge.
- The Institute on Social Entrepreneurship consists of a balanced series of seminar discussions, readings, group presentations, and lectures. Educational travel to other parts of the United States, local site visits, and volunteer opportunities will complement the coursework and classroom activities.
- The program will take place over the course of **five weeks** in June and July 2018. The final dates of the program will be known in April 2018. The students will be living in dormitories during the program for approximately four weeks and will travel domestically for approximately one week that will conclude with a 2-3 day program in Washington, DC.
- The Institute on Social Entrepreneurship will provide participants with an overview of how to employ entrepreneurial skills to address social issues. Topics may include microfinance, organizational development and management; grant writing; innovation, emerging, markets and risk analysis; strategic business planning; corporate social responsibility; and women and minorities in entrepreneurship.
- The program is fully funded, including international airfare, travel within the United States, accommodation, food, and program fees.

Can I apply for the Study of the U.S. Institutes?

Yes you can if...

- You are an Algerian citizen, living in Algeria, and attending school in Algeria.
- You are currently in your **1st year or 2nd year (LMD), 1st, 2nd or 3rd year (Classical System), 1st thru 4th year (i.e. Engineering studies or any similar curricula), 1st through 5th year (i.e. Medicine or any similar curricula)** and you are committed to returning home to complete your degree.
- You will be 18 to 25 years old as of **June 1st, 2018**.
- You are proficient in English.
- You have a sustained high level of academic achievement, as indicated by grades, awards, and teacher recommendations.
- You are mature, responsible, independent, open-minded, tolerant, thoughtful and inquisitive.
- You have a strong interest in learning about the United States.



- You are comfortable with campus life, prepared to share living accommodations, and able to adjust cultural and social practices different from those of your country.

How do I apply?

- 1- Download the application from <https://dz.usembassy.gov/education-culture/exchanges/> under « Undergraduate Programs ».
 - To be considered, an application package should include:
 - Completed application form.
 - Scanned copy of your last available academic transcript and a 2017-2018 school certificate.
 - Your personal statement in a separate Word document with your full name on the top of the page.

Note: Your application package should be sent as an attachment in an email, do not use drives, clouds or images in a body of an email to send your package.

- 3- Write in the subject line of your application's email: **YOUR NAME – SUSI 2017**
- 4- **Deadline to turn in the application is at 1700, 07 December 2017.**

Important: Please be informed that only successful candidates will be contacted for an interview. Interviews are scheduled for the first week of January 2018.

 - No. Documents such as transcripts and school certificates can be sent in the original language.

 - You can take a clear, visible picture of the document and send it as an attachment with your application.
- A document is missing in my application, what should I do?
 - If your document will be available before the interview date, you can apply and explain in your email why this document is missing and when will you be able to send it.
